Apothecary: You mix chemicals and herbs t make medicines like a pharmacist does today

Post rider: You deliver the mail.

Town Crier: you walk the streets at night to check on people, you call out the time, you light candles and

extinguish them in the morning.

Gunsmith: You make, repair, and sell guns.

Slave: You work on a plantation working in the fields. Gardener: You grow and take care of the community garden.

Saddle maker: You make, repair, and sell saddles

Soldier: You guard the ammunition of the town and you practice marching or playing drums.

Captain of the militia: You are in charge of the soldiers.

Minister: You are the leader of the the church. You give the daily sermon, marry people, baptize children, and

bury the dead.

Merchant of the General Store: You gather items and sell them in your store.

Seamstress: You are a dressmaker.

Tavern Owner: You own the town inn. An inn is where people eat, drink, be merry, and stay when they are visiting the town.

Weaver: You weave thread into material.

Governor: You represent the King as the law of the town.

Brewer: You make ale, beer, and wine.

Tithing man: You make sure that people do not sleep in church. You collect fees from people entering church.

Doctor: You visit sick people and take your bag of instruments with you to their houses.

School children: You attend the local school and learn your lessons by reciting rhymes, writing in a horn book, and reading from the Bible.

Dame of the School: You are the school teacher.

Farmer: You grow food (fruit and vegetables) on your farm.

Wigmaker: You make wigs for the men of the town. You sell them at your store.

Spinner: You spin wool into yarn and you dye the yarn so that it can be sold to be woven into cloth.

Livery: You take care of the horses in to stable and help to rent our the wagons.

Servant: You work inside a house to clean it, answer the door, etc.

Candle maker: You make and sell candles to the merchants in town.

Printer/Postman: You run a print shop and mail is delivered to you. The post rider gets the mail from you for delivery.

Jeweler: You buy and sell jewelry.

Sawyer: You own and work in the sawmill where you cut trees into lumber.

Grocer: You sell fresh fruit and vegetables in a open air tent.

Fur trader: You hunt, skin, and sell furs.

Butcher: You prepare the meat (beef, pork, chicken) for the town.

Stocks attendant: You watch over the people who have been placed in the stocks as punishment.

Dentist: You took care of people's teeth which included lots of pulling of teeth.

Glass Blower: You various glass products such as vases, bottles, pitchers.

Surveyor: You use surveyor's instruments to map the land.

Architect: You design buildings.

Lawyer: You work in the court and help defend people for crimes they are accused of committing.

Shipbuilder: You build ships.

Carpenter: You work with wood to make things such as buildings.

Rope maker: You braid ropes.

Sail maker: You sew sails for sailing ships.

Blacksmith: You make horseshoes and place them on the horses.

Cooper: You make wooden barrels.

Sailor: You sail on a ship to deliver goods. While on land, you whittle (make carvings our of small pieces of

Captain: You are the person in charge of the ship.

Whitesmith: You make tin objects such as lanterns.

Tailor: You sew men's clothes.

Barber: You cut men's hair and give them a shave.

Wheelwright: You make wagon wheels.

Miller: You have a windmill and you grind the town's corn, wheat, rye, and barley.

Clock maker: You make and sell clocks.

Cabinetmaker: You make cabinets for homes.

Silversmith: You work with silver to design fine silverware (tea pots, pitchers, utensils).

Pewterer: You work with pewter to make pitchers, cups, and mugs, and you sell your items.

Tanner: You tan or preserve cow hides to be used in leather goods such as shoes, pants, saddles, reins, etc.

Hatter: You make and sell men's hats.

Cobbler: You make, sell, and repair men's shoes.

Baker: You-bake and sell bread, cookies, and cakes.
